Rural England Prosperity Fund (part of levelling up)

Test Valley Borough Council has been awarded £500,000 to support its rural communities and businesses. £3,000 - £20,000 will be available to support new/improved COMMUNITY facilities/local art and heritage/rural green space and/or essential COMMUNITY services. £5,000 - £25,000 capital grants will be available for new and existing rural businesses to develop new products/services/equipment of wider benefit to the local economy (including farms)

Household Support Fund

The Household Support Fund is being distributed between April 2023 and March 2024 by the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) through County and Unitary Councils.

The objective of the Fund is to provide support to vulnerable households to help with significantly rising living costs and is intended to cover a wide range of households, including families with children of all ages, pensioners, unpaid carers, care leavers and disabled people.

£1.3 million of this Fund has been set aside for Community Grants to deliver local projects or activities that support residents most in need. Applications for funding from the FINAL round of the Community Grant are now open: see Household Support Fund - Community Grants. The deadline for applications is 26th January 2024.

Funding can be granted for eligible activities and support including:

- Energy and water: Support with energy and water bills.
- Food: including vouchers and free school meals.
- Essentials linked to energy and water (including sanitary products, warm clothing, soap, blankets, boiler service/repair, purchase of equipment including fridges, freezers, ovens, etc.) in recognition that a range of costs may arise which directly affect a household's ability to afford energy, food and water.

Wider essentials not linked to energy and water. These may include, but are not limited to, support with other bills including broadband or phone bills, clothing, and essential transport-related costs.

• Advice services: to commission and support advice services on budgeting, finances*, maximising income as well as accessing other help with food or fuel.

*Please note that if your application includes financial advice services, that any financial advice services will need to be provided by a qualified and regulated individual or online by a regulated organisation, in accordance with the FCA requirements**. You will need to be able to demonstrate a level of compliance with FCA regulations and be willing to provide evidence of this. Funding must be spent by 31 March 2024.

Travelling Pantry

Our amazing Travelling Pantry needs volunteers to help us to keep supporting the people of Test Valley.

The Pantry has become a lifeline for many people in the rural areas of the community who are struggling with the cost-of-living crisis. Many of our rural villages' residents have no reliable and cost-effective way to access the shops, food banks and pantries... so we take it to them.

No one should have to choose between paying a bill or eating a meal but that is the reality for a lot of people. With the help of our partners, food donations, our growing schemes and food waste prevention channels, we are able to provide good quality food

to those who need it the most. The Travelling Pantry has been such a great success that we now want to expand the service out to other areas as well as develop our offering in the areas we already cover. However, we cannot do this without more volunteers.

Could you spare up to 4 hours on a Wednesday or Friday to help us deliver this vital service? The role would include some manual handling and gives you a chance to make friends and engage with our Pantry shoppers! All training will be provided, as well as parking at our office by the Andover bus station for the duration of your shift. All we would need from you is a can-do attitude, a desire to make a difference and a willingness to have a bit of a chat because, for some of our service users, we are the only people they see all week!

Funding Drop In Sessions

Do you need help with your grant application?

We understand that applying for a grant can be overwhelming, and we are here to help!

During a session we can:

- · Check that you meet the grant criteria.
- Identify any gaps in what you tell them, so that you tell an engaging story.
- Confirm that the need for your project is supported by evidence.
- · Confirm that you show that you have the ability to meet those needs.
- Ensure that you spell out the differences that the project will make.
- Clearly define who the beneficiaries are.
- Advise on how beneficiaries can be included in the bid itself.
- Help connect you to potential partners or co-applicants where appropriate.
- Ensure that your budget adds up and is at the right level for the project.
- Review if the application will be successful.

We hold virtual "surgeries" to support groups looking for an independent review of their grant application. These take place at **10am** on the **third Thursday of every month, starting 21st**September 2023

Groups will be able to meet with a member of our team for advice and feedback as well as help finding other sources of potential funding.

Leaky Homes

Dragonfly Power is excited to announce that it will be holding a "**Leaky Homes**" roadshow that will visit communities and parishes around Test Valley in 2024!





During these visits, households and community buildings within participating communities will have the opportunity to sign up to receive a **free thermal imaging survey** of their properties and receive an associated energy efficiency report. This will be undertaken by a fully trained Dragonfly Power volunteer.

Thermal imaging surveys are a useful tool for showing areas of heat loss and help identify any insulation and draught proofing needs.

We would like to partner with Parish Councils, community centres and keen individuals to help promote and champion the leaky homes roadshow to households in their area between January to March 2024. Here's how you can get involved:

- 1. Register your interest for receiving a Leaky Homes Roadshow visit to your community by emailing enquiries@dragonflypower.org.uk.
- 2. We will get in contact with you to agree a suitable date for a visit. Ideally we would like to use the village hall or community centre as a hub for the evening where

- households can drop in to find out more about energy savings in their homes. We can discuss options for this when we contact you.
- 3. We will provide you with further information about the process and also materials and information to promote the visit to households in your area including details of how households can book a thermal imaging survey.
- 4. We will visit your community on the set date and hopefully start to help households in your area take action on their energy use!

In addition, we will also be holding a free Energy Awareness training session on Saturday 20th January at 10am at King's Somborne Village Hall. This session will be run by Dale Hoyland, a specialist in retrofit and thermal imaging. It is designed for anyone interested in finding out more about energy efficiency and will provide an outline of thermal imaging surveys. Representatives from The Environment Centre will also be present to advise on grants and support available to households in Test Valley.
